

The Arthritis Research Centre's Scientific Team had a phenomenal 2014. ARC's ground-breaking research has led to more funding to find new ways to prevent arthritis and understand key causes of complications caused by arthritis. Since its inception, ARC continues to lead the way in involving people living with arthritis and inflammatory diseases from idea generation to completion. Examples of this are two recent grants – one on inflammatory arthritis complications involves ARC's Arthritis Patient Advisory Board and three national arthritis consumer

organizations: Arthritis Consumer Experts, the Canadian Skin Patient Alliance, and the Canadian Society of Intestinal Research. The second, a digital media grant to get information out to patients involves four health care organizations from across Canada.

These are just a few examples of the approximately 75 research projects currently underway at ARC. We are immensely appreciative of the continued and generous support from all our funding agencies and donors. We will continue to work hard on your behalf, to find answers for all those struggling with arthritis.



## ROAR 2013


Each year, ARC's Arthritis Patient Advisory Board hosts "Reaching Out with Arthritis Research" (ROAR), an interactive public forum that aims to engage the arthritis community in conversations with scientists about arthritis research. This year's event, titled "Does a Google a day keep the doctor away?" brought together speakers with a variety of perspectives related to how we use online information to make decisions about our health, how mobile apps can help monitor our health, and how online information affects the relationship between the patient and the health care professional.

Over the past two years, ROAR has expanded from a local to an international scale by hosting an online webcast of

the event live and using social media to attract an even wider audience. An attendee following this year's event on Twitter wrote: "The connectivity of Twitter continues to amaze me. We have linked an Irish rheumatologist + Aust. Urogologist to a BC arth mtg. #eROAR13", proving that ARC research is truly reaching an international audience. Videos of the presentations are posted online, further increasing the accessibility of ARC research to the public. Some videos have been viewed more than 2000 times.

The next ROAR will be held on November 22nd at the Blusson Spinal Cord Centre, and will focus on the impact of arthritis in the hips, knees, hands and feet.


