TRAINEES

Trainee Grants and Awards

Natalie McCormick (Supervisor: Antonio Aviña) was the recipient of a Michael Smith Foreign Study Supplement (value: \$6,000) from the Canadian Institutes of Health Research (CIHR). Ms. McCormick spent three months at the University of California at San Francisco working with Professor Patricia Katz on a project entitled "Long-term health resource utilization and total economic burden following diagnosis of systematic autoimmune rheumatic diseases: a population-based study". Ms. McCormick also received the Santosh M. Wasan Graduate Student Travel Award from the Faculty of Pharmaceutical Sciences at UBC (value: \$500).

Ms. McCormick's third award was an Institute Community Support Travel Award from the CIHR's Institute for Health Services and Policy Research (value: \$1,500). She attended the 2016 Canadian Rheumatology Association Annual Scientific Meeting, where she presented three posters. The award was granted for her presentation on the Systemic Autoimmune Rheumatic Diseases survey "Feasibility of an approach to contact individuals from administrative health data to estimate the economic burden of systemic autoimmune rheumatic diseases at the general population level".

Clayon Hamilton (Supervisor: Linda Li) joined the Milan Ilich Arthritis Research Canada as a post-doctoral fellow doing clinical epidemiology work in knowledge translation. Dr. Hamilton has received a Michael Smith Foundation for Health Research Post-doctoral Fellowship Award for his project on developing and validating an outcome measure on meaningful patient engagement in research. He has already collaborated with APAB members on his project "Measuring Patient Engagement In Research (PEIRS)".

Adalberto Loyola-Sanchez is a new post-doctoral trainee at ARC Calgary (Supervisor: **Cheryl Barnabe**). His post-doctoral project title is "Sustainability in arthritis management programs for Indigenous populations of Canada and Mexico". Dr. Loyola Sanchez is the recipient of a \$50,000 Cummings School of Medicine Post-doctoral Scholarship from the University of Calgary. Dr. Loyola Sanchez also received a Canadian Institutes of Health Research Banting Postdoctoral Fellowship (\$70K/year for two years).

Pavan Mehat (Supervisor: **Mary De Vera**) was awarded a UBC Faculty of Pharmaceutical Sciences Graduate Research Award of \$2195. He was also awarded an Elwynn Gregg Memorial Fellowship of \$5,000 from the Faculty of Graduate and Postdoctoral Studies at UBC. The Elwynn Gregg Fellowship is awarded to help attract and keep research talent in British Columbia and Canada, with a focus on graduates in Medicine, Languages, Engineering and Forestry.

Behnam Sharif (Supervisor: **Deborah Marshall**) was the Co-Principal Applicant on a \$10,000 Planning and Data Collection Grant from the Clinical Research Fund, Faculty of Medicine, University of Calgary. The title of the grant is "Needs assessment and planning for development of a clinical risk calculator for early knee osteoarthritis progression". **Dr. Sharif** also received a \$165,000 Canadian Institutes of Health Research Knowledge to Action grant for his project "Building partnerships to improve care of early Knee Osteoarthritis Patients (KOA): Developing a risk management tool".

Gloria (Lingyi) Li is a new Masters trainee (Supervisor: **Antonio Aviña**), working on evaluating the risk of heart attacks and strokes in patients with ankylosing spondylitis (inflammatory back pain disease).

Both Ms. Li and Lindsay Belvedere (Research Assistant to Antonio Aviña) were awarded \$1,000 European Congress of Rheumatology EULAR 2016 Abstract awards in Clinical Science for their podium presentations at the EULAR meeting in June. Ms. Li's abstract was entitled "Improved survival in dermatomyositis and polymyositis: a general population-based study", and Ms. Belvedere's was entitled "Improved survival in giant cell arteritis: a population-based study". Ms. Li and Ms. Belvedere were also both recipients of the 2016 Arthritis Research Canada/Lilly Early Rheumatology Researcher Scholarships supporting participation in the 2016 EULAR Annual Meeting.

Jean-Francois Esculier (Supervisor: **Michael Hunt**) has received a \$165,000 Canadian Institutes of Health Research Fellowship for his project "The effects of running on knee cartilage measures in people with and without knee osteoarthritis". In this research project, they will explore if knee cartilage of older healthy runners react the same to a bout of running as those of younger runners. Then, they will compare the effects of running on knee cartilages of older people with and without OA.

Sharan Rai (Supervisors: **Antonio Aviña** & **Hyon Choi**) has been awarded a \$10,000 Arthritis Society Networking grant entitled "Patient Engagement in Research For the development of Educational videos for Knowledge Translation PERFECT-KT". Collivestigators on the grant are **Antonio Aviña**, **Mary De Vera**, **Linda Li**, **Kam Shojania** and **Hyon Choi**.

Sharan Rai received a separate \$10,000 grant from the Canadian Institutes of Health Research with the same co-investigators. That award is for a project entitled *"Toward the development of resources for gout education"*.

Alyssa Howren (Supervisor: **Mary De Vera**) has been awarded a \$175,000 Canadian Institutes of Health Research Frederick Banting and Charles Best Award to continue her Master's degree in the Faculty of Pharmaceutical Sciences at UBC. Her thesis title is "Patient and provider perspectives of an ehealth-supported collaborative care model for gout: a mixed methods study".

Serena Chen, (Supervisor: **Allyson Jones**) a Master's student at the University of Alberta, was awarded a prestigious \$30,000 Alberta Innovates Health Solutions/Alberta SPOR Unit: Patient Oriented Research Studentship. Her project title is "Falls and fear of falling in patients with total hip and knee replacements". This one year grant is potentially renewable for a second year.

Trainee Degrees

Tim Schmidt (Supervisor **Diane Lacaille**) successfully defended his Master's thesis "Cardiovascular disease prevention in rheumatoid arthritis: three population-based studies in British Columbia", earning an A+ and high praise from the examiners.

Cam Clayton (Supervisor: **Linda Li**) successfully defended his Master's thesis on his work involving the development of the RCT protocol for the TRACK-OA project (aka the Fitbit pilot) and completing a baseline analysis exploring the relationships between patients' perception of their engagement in health care and physical activity participation.

Pavan Mehat (Supervisors: **Mary De Vera, John Esdaile, Antonio Aviña Anne Townsend)** successfully defended his Master's thesis, "*Pharmaceutical Outcomes Research to Better Understand Medication Non-Adherence in Patients with Systemic Lupus Erythematosus*".

Claire Barber (Supervisors: John Esdaile & Deborah Marshall) successfully completed her PhD thesis defence in October 2015 at the University of Calgary. Dr. Barber's thesis was entitled "Development and testing of cardiovascular quality indicators for rheumatoid arthritis".

Glen Hazlewood (Supervisors: **Deborah Marshall** & Claire Bombardier (U of T)) successfully defended his PhD thesis in November at the Institute of Health, Policy, Management and Evaluation, University of Toronto. Dr. Hazlewood's thesis is entitled "A novel approach for integrating best evidence and patient preferences into treatment recommendations for rheumatoid arthritis".

Summer Studentships

Carol Dou (Supervisors: **Linda Li** and **John Esdaile**) received a Canadian Rheumatology Association summer studentship. Her project is entitled "Evaluating the role of motivation in physical activity participation in people with knee osteoarthritis".

Ola Kobza (Supervisor: **Diane Lacaille**) a second year medical student at the University of Ottawa was awarded a Canadian Rheumatology Association summer studentship for her project "Evaluation of the psychometric properties of a new presenteeism measure for arthritis studies". Presenteeism refers to someone making it to work but being less productive at work than normal.

Tim Liang and **Hans Haag** (Supervisor: **Mary De Vera**) were summer students at the Milan Ilich Arthritis Research Centre, Vancouver. **Mr. Liang's** project is "Inflammatory arthritis patients' perspectives on medication use: a thematic synthesis to inform evidence-based, patient-centered adherence interventions". **Mr. Haag's** project is entitled "Qualitative synthesis – ankylosing spondylitis".

Sujay Nagaraj (Supervisor: **Cheryl Barnabe**) received a McCaig Institute for Bone and Joint Health R. R. Singleton Summer Studentship Award for his project entitled "Do Aboriginal patients really have more severe inflammatory arthritis, or is that a reflection of difficulties in accessing care for diagnosis and management?"

Aaron Lin (Supervisor: **Cheryl Barnabe**) also received a McCaig/Singleton Award for his summer studentship project "to characterize the level of community engagement in arthritis studies involving Indigenous populations". Both Mr. Nagaraj and Mr. Lin were located at ARC Calgary.

<u>2016 Arthritis Research Canada/University of California at San Francisco (UCSF)</u> <u>Joint Scientific Meeting</u>

Twelve UCSF Faculty and visiting faculty and twelve Arthritis Research Canada trainees accompanied by five ARC faculty attended the 2016 Arthritis Research Canada/University of California at San Francisco (UCSF) Joint Scientific Meeting. The meeting was held at the new UCSF Mission Bay campus on April 14-15, 2016.

RESEARCH

Grants Funded

Paul Fortin and Sylvain Bourgoin were Co-Principal Applicants along with Co-investigator Eric Boilard on a \$790,000 five year CIHR grant entitled "Role of autotaxin bound to platelet-derived microparticles to development of vascular damage in arthritis."

Paul Fortin is also a Co-Investigator on a \$100,000 two year CIHR grant entitled "Make this break your last": pilot testing an educational intervention to improve fragility fracture patients' awareness of their risk for refracture." The Principal Investigator on this grant is Dorcas Beaton along with Co-Investigators Earl Bogoch, Debora Da Costa, Monique Gignac as well as others.

Paul Fortin and Linda Li are Co-Investigators on a \$290,000 three year grant from The Arthritis Society. It is entitled "Helping adolescents with juvenile arthritis and their parents to make informed and value-based decisions about pain relief modalities: development of a novel decision support intervention". The Principal Investigator on this grant is Karine Toupin April and Co-investigators include Adam Huber and Ciaran Duffy.

Ann Clarke (Principal Investigator) was awarded an infrastructure grant of \$80,000 from the Lupus Clinical Investigators Network (LuCIN). This is an infrastructure grant in preparation for later clinical studies that she will perform on behalf of LuCIN.

Cheryl Barnabe is a Co-Investigator on a \$25,000 Canadian Institutes of Health Research Planning and Dissemination Grant entitled 'Planning for the collaborative implementation of a peer-support shared decision making strategy by and with Aboriginal populations: building foundations for a program of research in health systems that treat chronic disease'. The Primary Investigator is Dr. Janet Jull.

Alysson Jones is the Principal Investigator on a grant of \$176,000 from the Covenant Health Network of Excellence for Seniors' Health and Wellness for her project entitled "Coaching for older adults (with osteoarthritis) for community health (COACH Study)". (Co-investigators: **Linda Li**, Lauren Beaupre). The project goal is to track and assess the effect of remote physiotherapist-led coaching which promotes physical activity among rural seniors who have undergone hip or knee replacements.

Deborah Marshall is the Principal Investigator on a \$4,000 Alberta Innovates Health Solutions (AIHS) Community and Planning Grant entitled 'Planning session for development of a clinical risk calculator for early knee osteoarthritis progression'. Co-Applicants on the grant include **Benham Sharif** (Supervisor: **Deborah Marshall**), **Jacek Kopec, Jolanda Cibere,** as well as Lee Green, Sylvia Teare, Jean Miller, Nancy Marlett, Denise Campbell-Scherer, and Tracy Wasylak.

Awards, Distinctions & Promotions

Diane Lacaille was appointed the Associate Head of Academic Affairs for the UBC Department of Medicine, effective September 15, 2015. Essentially, she is the Head of Research for the Department. This is huge recognition of her skills and leadership.

Linda Li was promoted to Full Professor of Physical Therapy at the University of British Columbia. Professor Li is the Canadian authority on Patient-oriented knowledge translation for arthritis, as well as a well-recognized authority internationally and undoubtedly the authority for knowledge translation in general in BC.

Antonio Aviña was promoted to Associate Professor of Medicine at the University of British Columbia. The promotion requires that the nominee be ranked 'Superior' in a number of categories such as research and teaching. Not surprisingly, Dr. Aviña has been highly successful in all aspects of research from obtaining grants, to publications and mentoring research trainees.

Glen Hazlewood and **Claire Barber**, both of ARC Calgary have been appointed Research Scientists at Arthritis Research Canada. They each successfully defended their PhD theses this year.

Catherine Backman has been appointed Senior Scientist at Arthritis Research Canada. In making the appointment the Board recognized Catherine for her academic success as well as for the recognition that her work has brought to Arthritis Research Canada outside of Canada, particularly her multiple awards from the Association of Rheumatology Health Professionals (ARHP)/American College of Rheumatology, including her upcoming Distinguished Lecture to the ARHP.

Paul Fortin was honoured with an invitation to be the lecturer for the 36th Annual Metro Ogryzlo Memorial Lectureship at the University of Manitoba on September 22, 2015. The lecture commemorates a Canadian pioneer in the field of rheumatology who was also a founder of the Journal of Rheumatology. The title of Dr. Fortin's talk was "Lupus or the Imitation Game?"

Cheryl Barnabe was awarded the Canadian Rheumatology Association (CRA)/Arthritis Research Foundation Best Epidemiology/Health Services Research Award for her podium presentation at the CRA annual meeting entitled "Biologic therapy complications in the Alberta Aboriginal population with rheumatoid arthritis". It highlights that Aboriginal patients on the new biologic drugs for rheumatoid arthritis experience more hospitalizations, serious infections, heart attacks and strokes, and cancers.

Cheryl Barnabe was also honoured by Calgary's Avenue Magazine in their 2015 'Top 40 Under 40'. The award honours educators, innovators and entrepreneurs in the arts, non-profits, oil and gas, law, finance or medicine who are at the top of their field.

Catherine Backman has begun a five year term as Associate Editor, Arthritis Care & Research. This is a leading journal with a focus on health services, rehabilitation, economic and social issues relevant to the care of people with rheumatic disorders.

Nick Bansback was presented with the Maurice McGregor Award by the Canadian Agency for Drugs and Technologies in Health at their recent 2016 Symposium in Ottawa. "The Maurice McGregor Award recognizes rising stars in Health Technology Assessment early in their careers".

Mary De Vera is the recipient of the 2016 GlaxoSmithKline/Canadian Society for Pharmaceutical Sciences Early Career Award. This award recognizes outstanding research achievements and contributions of pharmaceutical scientists, working in Canadian academia, industry, government or research institutes, in their first seven years following their graduation from a doctorate program.

Antonio Aviña was honoured at the BC Lupus Society Gala with the BC Lupus Research Award of Excellence in Research & Mentoring. This award recognizes excellence and productivity in the research of lupus and other related diseases. In the past year, **Dr. Aviña** has been lead author or co-author on 12 published papers and 49 research conference presentations.

NEW STAFF AND STAFF CHANGES

Brett Trainor was hired as the new Fund Development Administrative Assistant to **Patti Nakatsu**, Director of Development. Ms. Trainor took a leave from her position for the summer and returns to ARC at the beginning of September.
